Item 3 Interim financial statements

The Company's unaudited interim condensed consolidated for the nine months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017, including the unaudited interim Consolidated Balance Sheets, Consolidated Statements of Operations, Consolidated Statements of Comprehensive Loss and Consolidated Statements of Cash Flows and Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements, are filed separately and called Quarterly Report – Third Quarter and are hereby incorporated by reference into this Quarterly Report.

Item 4 Management's discussion and analysis or plan of operation

A. Plan of operation

This item is not applicable, as the Company has had net sales in each of the last two fiscal years.

B. Management's discussion and analysis of financial condition and results of operations (amounts in thousands, except share and per share amounts)

Mace Security International, Inc. currently operates in one business segment, the Security Segment, which manufactures and distributes consumer safety and personal defense products to retailers, distributors, and individual consumers. The Company also supplies less-lethal tactical munitions and weapons systems for law enforcement, correctional institutions and military markets.

Three months ended September 30, 2018 compared with three months ended September 30, 2017

Net Sales

On October 19, 2017, the Company completed the purchase of the business and substantially all related operating assets of Vigilant Protection Systems, a top rated personal security and home medical product e-commerce marketing business. The Company's results for fiscal year 2017 include the results of the acquired business from the date of acquisition. Net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2018 associated with the acquired business were \$860. Net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2018 increased 21.9% to \$3,447, compared with \$2,828 in the three months ended September 30, 2017. Net sales comparative information for the three months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017, respectively, is as follows:

The net increase in Consumer distribution channel net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017, is primarily attributable to increased sales to existing customers, as well as the impact of the October 2017 acquisition. The net increase in International distribution channel net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017, is primarily attributable to increased net sales of animal repellant products in Canada, as well as increased sales to existing international customers.

Cost of goods sold

Cost of goods sold increased in the three months ended September 30, 2018 by 27.0% to \$1,949, or 56.5% of net sales, compared with \$1,535, or 54.3% of net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2017, primarily due to the 21.9% increase in net sales and the expenses associated with the launch of a line of less lethal munitions to law enforcement, corrections and military customers through its subsidiary Mace Tactical Solutions, LLC.

Gross Profit

Gross profit increased \$205, or 15.9%, to \$1,498, or 43.5% of net sales, during the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with \$1,293, or 45.7% of net sales, during the three months ended September 30, 2017, primarily due to increased revenues, offset in part by expenses associated with the launch of a line of less lethal munitions to law enforcement, corrections and military customers through its subsidiary Mace Tactical Solutions, LLC.

Selling, General and Administrative Expenses

Selling, general and administrative expenses increased by \$207 to \$1,149, or 33.3% of net sales, during the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with \$942, or 33.3% of net sales in the three months ended September 30, 2017. The following table presents the significant expense items causing the increase in Selling, General and Administrative Expenses in the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017.

Depreciation

Depreciation expense in the three months ended September 30, 2018 was \$50, compared with \$49 in the three months ended September 30, 2017.

Interest income and expense

Interest expense decreased to \$5 in the three months ended September 30, 2018 compared with \$12 in the three months ended September 30, 2017, primarily due to the payment of the \$300 unsecured note payable to seller of acquired business in July 2018. Interest income was \$17 in the three months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017.

Amortization of intangible assets

Amortization of intangible assets relates to the amortization of intangible assets associated with the Company's 2017 acquisitions.

Loss on disposal of property and equipment

Loss on disposal of property and equipment of \$32 in the three months ended September 30, 2018 relates to the write-off of the residual net book value of the Company's old website due to the launch of the Company's new website in 2018.

Net income

Net income increased \$10 to \$206 in the three months ended September 30, 2018, compared with a net income of \$196 in the three months ended September 30, 2017, due primarily to the factors noted above.

Nine months ended September 30, 2018 compared with nine months ended September 30, 2017

Net Sales

On March 22, 2017, the Company completed the purchase of the business and substantially all related operating assets of Washington Laboratories, LLC, a private label producer of high quality defense spray products. On October 19, 2017, the Company completed the purchase of the business and substantially all related operating assets of Vigilant Protection Systems, a top rated personal security and home medical product e-commerce marketing business. The Company's results for fiscal year 2017 include the results of the acquired businesses from the dates of acquisitions. Net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 associated with the acquired businesses were \$2,393. Net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2017 increased by 22.8% to \$8,653, compared with \$7,048 in the nine months ended September 30, 2017. Net sales comparative information for the nine months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017, respectively, is as follows:

The net increase in consumer distribution channel net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017, is primarily attributable to the impact of the 2017 acquisitions, as well as increased sales to existing customers. The net increase in International distribution channel net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017, is primarily attributable to increased net sales of animal repellant products in Canada, as well as increased sales to existing international customers.

Cost of goods sold

Cost of goods sold increased in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 by 21.7% to \$4,952, or 57.2% of net sales, compared with \$4,068, or 57.7% of net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2017, primarily due to the 22.8% increase in net sales.

Gross Profit

Gross profit increased \$721, or 24.2%, to \$3,701, or 42.8% of net sales, during the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with \$2,980, or 42.3% of net sales, during the nine months ended September 30, 2017 primarily due to the factors noted above.

Selling, General and Administrative Expenses

Selling, general and administrative expenses increased by \$674 to \$3,447, or 39.8% of net sales, during the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with \$2,773, or 39.3% of net sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2017. The following table presents the significant expense items causing the increase in Selling, General and Administrative Expenses in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with the same period in 2017.

Depreciation

Depreciation expense in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 increased \$8 to \$147, compared with \$139 in the nine months ended September 30, 2017, due primarily to the March 2017 acquisition of property and equipment and the 2018 launch of the Company's new website.

Interest income and expense

Interest expense was \$33 and \$30 in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017, respectively. Interest income was \$67 and \$71 in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, and 2017, respectively.

Amortization of intangible assets

Amortization of intangible assets relates to the amortization of intangible assets associated with the Company's 2017 acquisitions.

Net loss

Net loss increased by \$52 to a loss of \$87 in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with a net loss of \$35 in the nine months ended September 30, 2017, due primarily to the factors noted above.

Liquidity and Capital Resources

Cash and cash equivalents and restricted cash decreased by \$578 to \$84 at September 30, 2018, compared with \$662 at December 31, 2017. The Company's operating activities of continuing operations used \$251 of cash in the nine months ended September 30, 2018, compared with providing \$272 in the nine months ended September 30, 2017. In the nine months ended September 30, 2018, depreciation, equity compensation and other non-cash charges totaled \$524. Changes in operating assets and liabilities used \$688 of cash due primarily to factors resulting from normal business conditions of the Company, including (1) higher accounts receivable due to higher net sales, and (2) higher accounts payable due to timing of payments, and (3) lower accrued expenses due to payment of accrued employee compensation and accrued cooperative advertising and other sales allowances.

The Company's capital expenditures in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 were \$176, compared with \$74 in the nine months ended September 30, 2017. The Company anticipates total fiscal 2018 capital expenditures will be approximately \$250 and will relate principally to enhancements to the Company's website and manufacturing and production equipment. The Company anticipates funding future capital expenditures from operating cash flow. At September 30, 2018, the Company had no capital expenditure commitments outstanding.

The Company has a \$1,500 credit agreement with a bank (the "Credit Agreement"), that is secured by substantially all the Company's assets and payable on demand. The Credit Agreement provides for monthly interest payments at a rate equal to LIBOR plus 1.75%. The interest rate was 3.859% and \$50 was drawn upon the Credit Agreement at September 30, 2018.

In connection with its March 2017 acquisition, the Company entered into a 5% \$1,000 secured note payable to the seller of acquired business due March 22, 2022. The note is subordinated to the bank line of credit and is collateralized by all of the Company's assets. The outstanding balance at September 30, 2018 was \$726.

In connection with its October 2017 acquisition, the Company entered into a 5% \$300 unsecured contingent note payable to seller of acquired business which matured on April 19, 2018. This obligation is subordinated to the bank line of credit. In the second quarter of 2018, the Company determined that the financial objectives with respect to the \$300 contingent note payable were met. This obligation was paid to the seller of the acquired business during the third quarter of 2018.

The Company has not declared or paid any cash dividends within the last two (2) fiscal years and does not anticipate paying any such dividends in the foreseeable future. The Company currently intends to retain all of its earnings for the operation and expansion of its business.

The Company believes that funds provided by operations and existing working capital should be sufficient to meet working capital needs for the next 12 months.

C. Off-balance sheet arrangements

In the ordinary course of business, the Company is party to certain arrangements that are not reflected in the Consolidated Balance Sheets. This includes operating leases as described in Note 15 to the Company's September 30, 2018 consolidated financial statements, which primarily relate to the Company's primary facility in Cleveland, Ohio and a warehouse in Perry, Florida. The Company does not have any obligations that meet the definition of an off-balance sheet arrangement that have had, or are reasonably likely to have, a material effect on the Company's financial condition or results of operations.
